California Group Led by Gordon & Rees Partner Joins Attorneys in Chicago To Form New Nationwide Practice with More than 30 Lawyers; Firm Focused Exclusively on Representing the Interests of Global Insurers

### WOMEN COMPRISE THE MAJORITY OF FIRM'S PARTNERS

**CHICAGO – Jan. 7, 2014** – Twenty-nine attorneys from Chicago-based Bates Carey Nicolaides LLP announced today they have left the firm and have been joined by four attorneys led by Gordon & Rees LLP partner Sara Thorpe to form a new insurance coverage law firm: **Nicolaides Fink Thorpe Michaelides Sullivan LLP**. The new practice is among the largest U.S. firms focused solely on representing the interests of global insurers, and one of the very few with a majority of female founding partners.

The firm's founding partners in Chicago are **Richard Nicolaides**, **Jr**., **Matthew Fink**, **Barbara Michaelides** and **Monica Sullivan**. In addition, California founding partner **Sara Thorpe** will manage offices in both San Francisco and Los Angeles. For example:

The firm's attorneys have been litigating intellectual property infringement and unfair business practice disputes across the country for more than a decade. They have secured determinations that their clients did not have a duty to defend or indemnify such policyholders as Discover Financial Services, the Walgreen Company, and Dish Network in patent infringement litigation under their respective "advertising injury" coverage provisions.

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Likewise, the firm's attorneys have secured rulings that commercial disparagement allegations cannot trigger "personal and advertising injury" coverage where the alleged disparagement is not directed at the underlying claimant, and determinations that false-advertising, antitrust and price-fixing claims do not trigger a duty to defend under "personal and advertising injury" coverage.

- The firm's attorneys have been at the forefront of addressing coverage issues in the context of terrorism financing lawsuits. They recently prosecuted an appeal before the Ohio Court of Appeals from a declaratory judgment that a liability insurer had a duty to defend Chiquita against tort claims arising from Chiquita's Colombian operations, which had allegedly bankrolled various terrorist groups in the country for decades. The appellate court reversed and entered judgment for the insurer, finding no coverage because Chiquita's conduct was intentional and the injuries had occurred outside the policies' coverage territory.
- Construction defect claims: The firm's attorneys represent insurers in coverage litigation throughout the country, including Vermont, Colorado and California. At stake are multi-million-dollar claims under complex owner-controlled insurance programs arising from myriad construction defects at large residential and commercial developments. The cases involve many unique issues including the constitutionality of retroactive statutes, the applicability of bad faith statutes to owner claims, and policy reformation.
- Asbestos claims continue to present an enormous liability for the insurance industry. The firm's
  attorneys have served as lead trial counsel in the complex departments of California State courts
  representing excess insurers in the uncharted waters of exhaustion of primary
  insurance, products versus operations, and stacking of limits.
- <u>Cyber-crimes, hacking and data security</u> represent a new wave of global exposures faced by institutions and corporations in the digital world. Insurance companies increasingly are dealing with claims arising from violations of privacy, property and theft of information stemming from cyber intrusions. The firm's attorneys are litigating cases of first impression, such as the one in New York State Court where they represent an insurance company against Sony Corporation. The case involves the issue of whether a commercial general liability policy provides coverage for claims arising out of computer hacking and, in this case, the alleged exposure of the personal information of millions of Sony's PlayStation® network customers. The firm also works with insurers to assess related risks, including counseling regarding the underwriting and evaluation of recently developed cyber-liability insurance.

The firm's attorneys are considered thought leaders in their field, winning litigators, and highly successful counselors on a wide variety of insurance-related practice areas, including: Appellate; bad faith; Bermuda market; commercial transportation; construction defects; environmental/toxic tort; first-party property; intellectual property; life; managed care and health care; policy drafting and claims management; primary and excess general liability; and professional/ management liability.
